**Event Description**

This panel is a response to the present need for interdisciplinary collaborations to address social injustices—specifically, antisemitism. Recent events require us to reconsider the ways we are in a relationship with one another, the ways in which we challenge social injustices, the ways we gather, and the ways we teach.

The panel is sponsored by the Department of Social Work and Child Advocacy, the Department of Religion, the Department of Educational Foundations, and the Holocaust, Genocide, and Human Rights Education Project. Funding is provided by a College of Humanities and Social Sciences Interdisciplinary Groups Grant. Additional collaborators include RIGS (Research on Interdisciplinary Global Studies, a faculty-driven network of scholars from every university college and school), as well as Hillel—a Jewish organization on campus that strives to provide a safe and comfortable environment for students of all backgrounds.

The panel is interdisciplinary because a response to antisemitism requires collective action and collaboration between and among academic and non-academic professional settings, university student spaces, and the general public.
